PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

What is Professional Development?

 New skills gained through continued education, workshops, on the job training, certifications; can be formal or informal


What are the benefits of PD?

- Stronger team; team cohesion
- Employees report higher confidence in their work
- Investment in employees results in less turnover

PD AND SUSTAINABILITY

How does a PD plan support sustainability?

- Employees engaged in PD are more likely to stay engaged in their work
- Effective PD develops leadership skills, which will be invested back into the organization
- Supports integration of the work into organizational operations and culture
- Skills needed to implement and evaluate program become part of organizational standards

EFFECTIVE PD AND STUDENT IMPACTS

How does a well -trained and culturally humble workforce impact youth outcomes?

- Skills training can increase competency and energy, which can impact program performance
- Learn new teaching techniques to meet needs of all learners
- Safe and supportive environments boost student recruitment and retention
- Staying current on issues ensures up to date and accurate information



EFFECTIVE PD AND STUDENT IMPACTS

- Broaden/create new partnerships
 - Faith-based partnerships (church staff, parents, nonprofit organization)
- Connecting curriculum content to partner organization's values and own curriculum
 - Youth Ministry
 - O Substance Use Group Sessions

- Staff and participant feedback
- Staff evaluations
- Review program goals and objectives
- Understand changing needs of population
- Identify demographic shifts and trends


