

# PROBLEM: PARENT CONSENT




- IRB mandated parent consent for youth survey participation, leading to loss of youth voice.
- CPRD strategies:
  - Trainings on youth survey importance.
  - Detailed consent forms highlighting participation benefits.
  - Incentives for parental consent.

## PROBLEM: PARENT CONSENT

Low response rates persisted, worsened by COVID, raising data representativeness concerns


Survey Year	Youth Served	Surveys Completed	Response Rate
2018/19	5,508	2,123	39%
2019/20	6,936	3,723	54%
2020/21	8,105	900	11%
2021/22	8,523	3,900	46%
Totals	29,072	10,646	37%

# SOLUTION: PARENT NOTIFICATION



CPRD pursued waiver of parent consent in favor of parent notification.

- Parent notification includes all consent information; opt-out form required only for non-participation.
- Utilized Public Act 102-0522 and Senate Bill 0818
- Collaborated with ISBE.

# SOLUTION: PARENT NOTIFICATION


#### Arguments to IRB:

- ✓ ISBE normalized comprehensive sexual health education.
- ✓ Evaluation aligns with educational practices.
- ✓ Parent notification complies with state requirements.




### RESULTS: IMPROVED RESPONSE RATES

IRB approved parent notification process on October 4, 2022



2021-22 response rate with parent consent



2022-23 response rate with parent notification
